We do seek to reduce the risk of exposure and, therefore, do not use or serve peanuts, peanut products or tree nuts on camp property. Nuts, or products containing nuts, will not be available in our tuck shop. However, the foods we purchase and serve may contain traces of nut products.

*Food Parcels*: No food is allowed in cabins because of the potential problem of attracting animals, so please do not send or bring food parcels to camp.
